Shepherds were in the fields, taking turns watching their flock by night. An angel from the Lord suddenly appeared to them. The glory of the Lord filled the area with light, and they were terrified. The angel said to them, "Don't be afraid! I have good news for you..."

(Luke 2:8)

The angels at Bethlehem were terrifying strangers, but the shepherds welcomed them anyway. In Biblical times, to "welcome the stranger" was a reminder that foreigners were heralds, bringing useful news, customs, and technologies from afar. To turn a stranger away was to turn one's back on a gift from God. The three Wise Men could follow a star, but sometimes, Jesus is hard to find. Our Catholic faith shows us we can sometimes find the way to Jesus through a stranger. After his resurrection, Jesus walked the road to Emmaus with his friends, Cleopas and Mary. But they did not recognize him. Some theologians believe this was because their grief and depression over his crucifixion blinded them. They let doubt and pessimism supplant hope and faith. When the village of Emmaus finally came into view, the couple insisted this "stranger" spend the night. Finally, in the breaking of the bread, they recognized Jesus. Grief and anxiety, depression and hurriedness, doubt and intellectualism can keep us from recognizing that Jesus is walking with us. This Christmas, we pray, that like Cleopas and Mary, you welcome the stranger and through that experience are led more deeply into friendship with the living Christ.

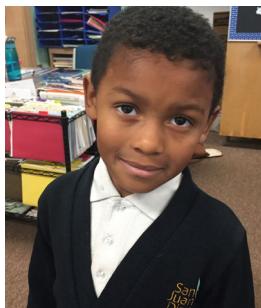

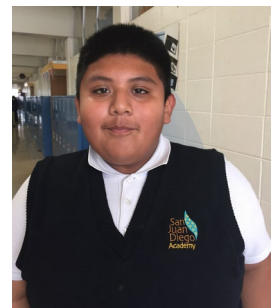

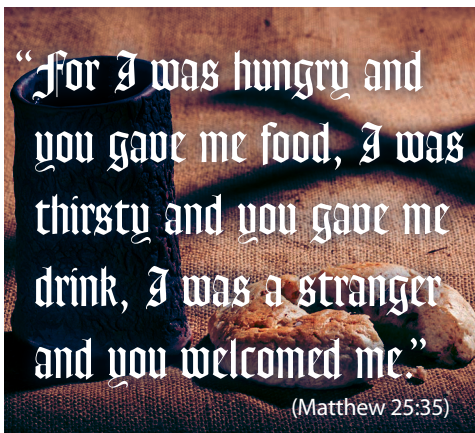

Christmas is a time for miracles. But, at San Juan Diego Academy miracles happen everyday and nearly always involve strangers and the people who journey with them: The Latino 6th grader who achieves Honor Roll as his volunteer tutor proudly looks on. The mom who cries into a patterned hankie as a translator explains her daughter has been offered a math prize. The Spanish-speaking father, dead from cancer at age 44, whose faith and generous spirit inspired an entire school and united a parish. Like our students, Jesus was a stranger in his own land. History suggests Jesus was an Aramaic-speaking Jew in a culture dominated by Latin-speaking Roman pagans and would have lived poor, suspect and marginalized. Jesus' teachings on the stranger are many, but one thing is always clear: What we do for the stranger, we do for him. As Pope Francis puts it, "Every stranger who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ." And, isn't that miracle enough?
